MEMBER'S GUIDE

Rights, Responsibilities and Code of Conduct

Welcome to the International Anti-Corruption Assembly

This guide outlines the key principles, rights and responsibilities of every IACA member.

1. ABOUT IACA

The International Anti-Corruption Assembly (IACA) is an international civil society organization founded in 2014 and registered in Ukraine. IACA operates in accordance with its Statute and the principles of the United Nations Convention Against Corruption (UNCAC). The organization maintains representative offices and authorized members across multiple countries.

2. MEMBER RIGHTS

- Participate in IACA activities, projects and events at national and international level
- Receive official IACA membership credentials with QR verification
- Access organizational resources, legal guidance and anti-corruption tools
- Submit proposals and initiatives to the Central Committee
- Benefit from IACA's international network and partnerships
- Receive protection and support in whistleblower-related matters

3. MEMBER RESPONSIBILITIES

- Uphold IACA's Statute, Mission and ethical standards at all times
- Act in good faith and in the best interests of the organization and civil society
- Refrain from any actions that may damage IACA's reputation or the safety of other members
- Maintain confidentiality regarding sensitive information entrusted by the organization
- Report any known cases of corruption, fraud or abuse through proper channels
- Keep personal information in the IACA registry up to date
- Not use IACA credentials for personal commercial gain or unauthorized purposes

4. CREDENTIAL VERIFICATION SYSTEM

Each IACA member receives official credentials bearing a unique QR code. This QR code allows any third party — including government bodies, international organizations and UN agencies — to

instantly verify the authenticity and current status of the member's credentials by visiting the official IACA website. This system ensures institutional transparency while protecting members' personal safety and confidentiality.

5. CONFIDENTIALITY AND SAFETY

Given the nature of IACA's work in anti-corruption and whistleblower protection, the organization maintains strict confidentiality procedures. The full membership registry is not publicly disclosed. Members operating in high-risk environments may request additional protective measures from the Central Committee.

6. DISCIPLINARY PROVISIONS

Membership may be suspended or revoked by decision of the Central Committee in cases of: violation of the IACA Statute or Code of Conduct; actions causing harm to the organization or its members; providing false information during registration; misuse of IACA credentials.
